NOTICE OF RACE (NoR)

Issue 2 (incorporating Amendment 1, issued 24th March 2021)

The Organising Authority implements the RYA Racing Charter and Competitors will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book (Racing Rules of Sailing) and on the RYA website www.RYA.org.uk

The notation [DP] in a rule means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may be at the discretion of the protest committee. This changes RRS 64.2

All times in this document are BST.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The RRS are changed as follows
 - 1.2.1 RRS 1.2: Add - A personal flotation device shall be worn at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices.
 - 1.2.2 RRS63 (Hearings): (Hearings) is amended to allow RYA arbitration.
 - 1.2.3 The Sailing Instructions may also change other RRS.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

A printable version of the Sailing Instructions will be available online from 12:00 on Saturday 31st July at www.dartmouthsailingweek.com . Any amendments after this time will be posted on the official notice board and announced at the daily briefing.

3 COMMUNICATION

The official notice board will be located in the clubhouse at Dittisham Sailing Club.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1 The event is open to all boats complying with their class rules for racing.

4.2 The classes are defined as follows:

Laser (standard rig)

Laser (radial rig)

National Solo

PY Handicap.

Additional classes may be created according to entries.

4.2 The minimum number for any class shall be five boats.

4.3.1 Boats may register their interest in entering the event by completing the Advance Registration online at www.dartmouthsailingweek.com/how-to-enter

4.3.2 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees. Details on how to enter and pay are available online at www.dartmouthsailingweek.com/how-to-enter

4.3.3 The following dates shall apply

Advance Registration opens (no initial fee)	4 th March
Entry opens (fee payable).	1 st June
Advance Registration closes	00:01 on 1 st July
Advance Registration to Entry conversion closes	00:01 on 1 st August

4.4 **Late entries online:** will be accepted at the daily fee up to 00:01 on Sunday 15th August.

4.5 **Late entries in person:** will be accepted at Dittisham Sailing Club at the daily fee up to 1 hour before the first warning signal of the day.

4.6 **Entry cancellations:** Prior to 1st August a 4% administration fee will be charged, thereafter 50% until one week prior to the races entered. Refunds after the latter date will only be made in exceptional circumstances.

- 4.7 **Event cancellation:** If for any reason associated with the current pandemic, this event is cancelled; entrants will be offered the options of a full refund or to carry over their entry to 2022.

5 FEES

Discounted entries are only available for fees received by 00.01 on 1st August.

6 CREW LIMITATIONS

Young competitors shall comply with the following:

- 6.1 Competitors under 18 years, with the exception of those sailing in the same boat as their parent/guardian/grandparent, shall submit a Parent/Guardian Consent Form to the Race Officer no later than 40 minutes before the first race to be sailed by that individual. Forms are available from the OA.
- 6.2 Boats sailed solely by competitors under the age of 18:
In addition to the requirement of NoR 6.1, at least one parent/guardian or their nominated representative shall be in attendance at all times at Dittisham Sailing Club, while that boat is sailing or the competitors are ashore.

7 ADVERTISING

- 7.1 Advertising may be displayed in accordance with the World Sailing Advertising Code.
- 7.2 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.

8 SCHEDULE

- 8.1 Registration at Dittisham Sailing Club from 08:30 on Sunday 15th August.
- 8.2 Daily briefing: 45 minutes before the first warning signal of the day.
- 8.3 Dates of racing: Sunday 15th to Wednesday 18th August inclusive.
- 8.4 Number of races: There will be two scheduled races per day for all classes. Additional races may be run according to the prevailing or predicted conditions.
- 8.5 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race on Sunday 15th August is 10:25. Thereafter the first warning signal time for the following day will be advised at the briefing.
- 8.6 On the last day of scheduled racing no warning signal will be made after 15:25.
- 8.7 Prize Giving: 17:30 on Wednesday 18th August at Dittisham Sailing Club.

9 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

If applicable, boats shall produce or verify the existence of a valid measurement certificate, when requested to do so by the OA.

[DP] Boats shall also comply with RRS 78.1 and may be inspected by the OA at any time during the event.

10 VENUE

NoR Addendum A shows the location of the venue and racing areas.

11 THE COURSES

Courses will be chosen to make best use of the river and conditions.

12 SCORING

12.1 The Low Points scoring system of Appendix A of the RRS will apply.

12.2 (a) One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

(b) When four or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(c) When five or six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

(d) When more than six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst two scores.

13 BERTHING

During the event, visiting boats may be parked in the boat park at Dittisham as directed on arrival by the Beachmaster.

14 DATA PROTECTION

The personal information you provide to the OA will be used to facilitate your participation in the event. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the organizing authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

15 RIGHTS TO USE THE NAME AND LIKENESS

By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the OA the right to make, use and show, at their discretion, any photograph, audio and video recordings and other reproduction of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

16 RISK STATEMENT

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, committee boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

17 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3 million per incident or the equivalent. Boats shall provide the OA with their insurance policy provider and policy number, at any time during the event if required to do so.

18 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded according to entries.
